This segregated fund invests primarily in Canadian fixed income currently through the MFS Fixed Income Fund Pooled.

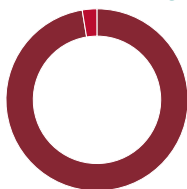

Are there any guarantees?

This fund is being offered under an insurance contract. It comes with guarantees that may protect your investment if the markets go down. The MER includes the insurance cost for the guarantee. For details, please refer to the information folder and contract.

Who is this fund for?

A person who is investing for the medium to longer term and seeking potential for interest income in their portfolio and is comfortable with low risk. Since the fund invests in bonds, its value is affected by changes in interest rates.

How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how the fund has performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after the MER has been deducted.

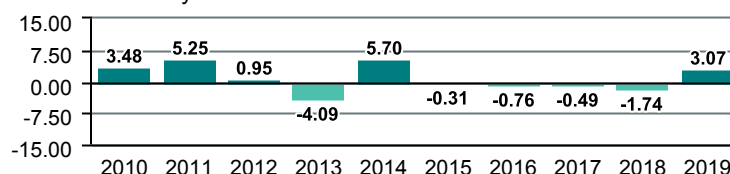
It's important to note that this doesn't tell you how the fund will perform in the future. Also, your actual return will depend on the guarantee level you choose and on your personal tax situation.

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in the fund on December 31, 2009 would have \$1,111.17 on December 31, 2019. This works out to an average of 1.06% a year.

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How much does it cost?

The following table shows the fees and expenses you could pay to invest in or redeem units of the fund.

1. Sales charges

Sales charge option	What you pay	How it works

2. Ongoing expenses

The MER includes the management fee and operating expenses of the fund. The MER includes the insurance cost for the guarantee. You do not pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the return you get on your investment. For details about how the guarantees work, see the applicable guarantee section of your insurance contract.

Trailing commission

Canada Life pays a trailing commission of up to 0.50% of the value of your investments for the services and advice provided to you. The trailing commission is paid out of the management fee for as long as you hold the fund.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you redeem or switch units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2% of the value of units you redeem or switch within 90 days of investing in the fund.
Switch fee	You may make up to 3 free switches in each calendar year and after that you may be charged a fee.

What if I change my mind?

You can change your mind and cancel the investment fund contract, the initial pre-authorized chequing premium or any lump-sum premium you apply to the policy by telling us in writing within two business days of the earlier of the date you received confirmation of the transaction or five business days after it is mailed to you.

Your cancellation request has to be in writing, which can include email or letter. The amount returned will be the lesser of the amount of the premium being cancelled or the value of the applicable units acquired on the day we process your request. The amount returned only applies to the specific transaction and will include a refund of any sales charges or other fees you paid.
